An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. We have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of our audit. In our opinion, proper books of accounts have been kept by the Trust so far as appears from our examination of those books.
- During the current financial year, the Trust has in terms of the provisions of Section 11(2) of the Income Tax Act, 1961, accumulated donation income amounting to Rs 3,742,544 being the differential between the amount spent for charitable purposes during the year and 85% of the donation income received. The said amount will be applied for charitable purposes in future. The trust is taking necessary steps to comply with the conditions specified under Section 11(2) of the Income-tax Act, 1961 to be eligible for such accumulation.
